

ORDINANCE 01-1971

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FISHINGCREEK TOWNSHIP, COLUMBIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ENACTING AND ORDAINING THAT A CERTAIN TOWNSHIP ROAD OR HIGHWAY IN FISHINGCREEK TOWNSHIP BE DECLARED VACATED AND FREED FROM PUBLIC USE, TRAVEL AND MAINTENANCE.

WHEREAS, Township Route No. 660, extending southeastwardly from its intersection with L.R. 19070 for approximately 325 feet to its intersection with Township Route No. 631 has been determined to be no longer required or necessary for use of the general public as a means of travel, more suitable routes being available; and

WHEREAS, all neighboring property owners have been notified of the said proposed vacation and have agreed to such action;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained and enacted as follows:

1. That Fishing Creek Township Route 660 beginning at its intersection with L.R. 19070 and extending southeastwardly therefrom for a distance of approximately 325 feet to its intersection with Township Route 631 is hereby declared vacated and freed from public use and travel and maintenance.
2. That this Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Section 1101 of the Second Class Township Code.
3. That this Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after the date of enactment.
