- R. Wenner asked why money being spent on Kinney Hill Rd. County grant will fund most of this project. Wenner stated he does agree with tar & chip. Supervisors and some residents in attendance stated there is much more traffic on Township roads and dirt roads are not practical currently.
- Resident Blakeney stated Federal government cracked down on dirt roads in the 70's, and indicated roads were to be tar & chipped. He questioned if he would be permitted to cut back the bank near his residence to make mowing easier. Will dump fill on other areas of his property. He will get price from contactor and notify Supervisors to inspect work area. J. Kline will ask Barry Travepiece of the Conservation District to look at site.
