Minutes of September 1, 2015 Regular Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6 PM by Chairman J. Challingsworth.

The August meeting minutes reviewed. J. Kline made motion to approve, seconded by E. Bogert. Motion carried.

The financials were reviewed. Additional invoice from Yost \$705.06 for hauling. Invoice for approximately \$2100 for cinders has not been received. J. Kline made motion to approve, seconded by E. Bogert. Motion carried.

Reports:

Road Foreman:

- Mow roads; berm; cold patch; equipment maintenance. Replace two pipes on Martenas Road to ready for Dirt & Gravel project. Waiting for okay from One Call to replace pipe and box pave Stillwater Cemetery Road.

Old Business:

-Township was outbid for 2003, 550 Ford. Final bid \$32,000 from Alaska.
-All three Supervisors and D. Bogert traveled to Spring Mills, Greg Twp. to inspect 1998 Ford truck. Some surface rust, good mechanical condition. 78,000 miles, 6100 hours. Includes plow and spreader. No CDL required. Township will offer \$13,255. Motion to purchase 1998, 750 Ford truck made by J. Kline, seconded by E. Bogert. Motion carried. Will look at new truck in approximately five years.
-Have not heard from Auditor General's office regarding Huntington Valley Fire Department.

New Business:

-A representative from FEMA Region 3 and PEMA Harrisburg spent most of the day on August 20 meeting with Township Supervisors. A report on findings has been received by the township indicating no major problems. They offered several suggestions and some mandatory recommendations on procedures. Certain recommendations must be met by the Township to

allow Township residents to purchase flood insurance. Township may need to look into a adopting a zoning ordinance.

- D. Kishbaugh questioned when old Ford (fondly known as the gas burner) will be scrapped and if Kishbaugh could purchase. J. Challingsworth stated many parts need to be removed before the truck will be scrapped.
